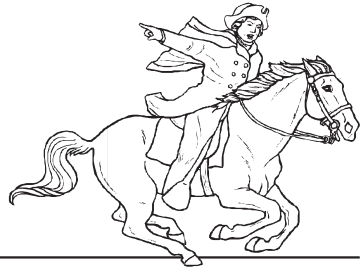

# ***The Cromwell Valley CSA & Fresh Veggies***

I don't know about you, but I'm tired of thinking about snow. I'm thinking about spring, gardening, fresh vegetables and salads. Yum. I've been a member of the **Cromwell Valley Community Supported Agriculture (CSA) project**, located right nearby in Cromwell Valley Park, for the past 5 years. My vegetables are grown locally by very experienced organic farmers (who live right on the premises) and harvested the same day I pick them up. They can't be any fresher. No chemical pesticides, herbicides or fertilizers are used to grow my vegetables, so I know that they are very good for me and my family and don't harm the environment like vegetables grown conventionally so often do. I'm supporting local agriculture too and I'm having a ball. And the park is SO beautiful.

Lots of parents bring their kids with them for their weekly vegetable pick up (or to pick-your-own raspberries or blackberries), to work some volunteer hours, or to see the horses and chickens or to take a hike. Many love having the opportunity to feel a part of farming life and to see how their food is grown.

The idea behind Community Supported Agriculture is that when people in the community join together to share the costs of farming (seeds, labor, tools etc.) in advance, it allows the farmer to grow the food in the best manner possible without the stress of weather, bugs or whatever else threatening to put him out of business. The community then gets to share equally in the harvest. In a drought year our shares are smaller. In a good year we share incredible abundance.

There are only about 20 shares left. If you are interested in finding out more about the Cromwell Valley CSA, call 410-880-2428 and leave a message, or go to the website [www.earthome.org](http://www.earthome.org) and click on the "CSA's" or "Join CSA" links.

A regular share costs \$475, but you can share that with another family. It's well worth it for 20 some weeks of the best food possible. How about getting your neighbors involved? There's nothing like sharing food to enhance the feeling and spirit of community.

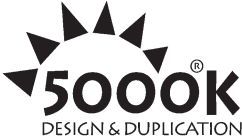

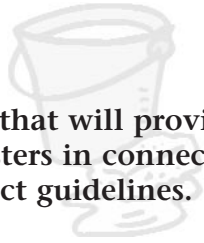

### **Acceptable Items:**

General residential household items including appliances (refrigerators, dishwasher, dryers, washers, air conditioners, etc.), bound shrubs and bushes (garden waste), lawn mowers, hot water heaters, furniture (beds, including box spring and mattresses), TV's etc, metal items will be separated at the site.

### **Unacceptable Items:**

Controlled hazardous waste and liquids of any type (caustics, pesticides, chemicals), explosive materials, flammable materials, propane tanks, medical/special medical waste, radioactive waste septic or sewage waste, paint, asbestos, drums or tanks (unless empty and flattened, or crushed with tops removed, or empty with holes in the top), animal carcasses, vehicle tires (on or off rim), vehicles or large vehicle parts, pieces of concrete curb or gutter, tree stumps greater than 12" in height and more than 36" across the roots, wire and steel cable, campers, pick-up caps, etc.

As in prior years, we request that you utilize curbside recycling for glass, paper, plastics, and metals. Please patronize the weekly refuse collection for acceptable trash and garbage. In order to eliminate any misunderstanding, community volunteers will be stationed at the site to monitor refuse being placed in containers to ensure compliance with
