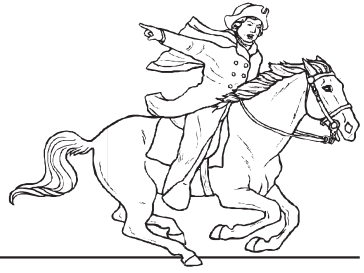

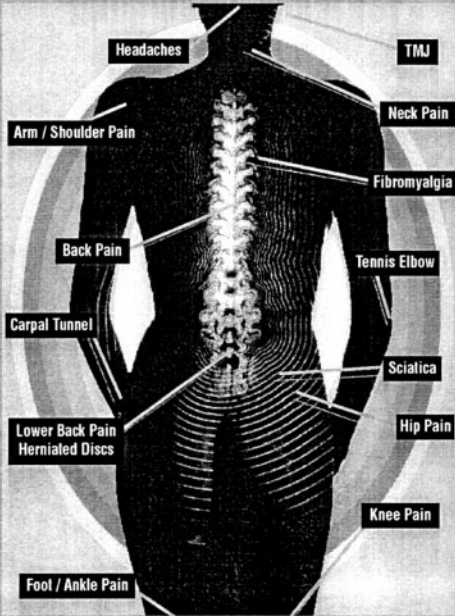

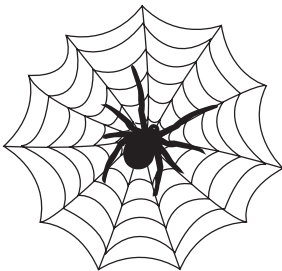


One Man's Trash...

Village Clean-Up Day

Loch Raven Village Association is sponsoring a Clean-Up Day for our community on Saturday, October 9, 2004 at the Pleasant Plains Elementary School parking lot. The collection time is 8 A.M. to 12 P.M. (or until all dumpsters are filled). Refuse dumpsters will be parked on the school lots and will accept discarded items and refuse under very strict guidelines.

Acceptable Items:

General residential household items including appliances (refrigerators, dishwasher, dryers, washers, air conditioners, etc.), bound shrubs and bushes (garden waste), lawn mowers, hot water heaters, furniture (beds, including box spring and mattresses), TV's etc, metal items will be separated at the site.

Unacceptable Items:

Controlled hazardous waste and liquids of any type (caustics, pesticides, chemicals), explosive materials, flammable materials, propane tanks, medical/special medical waste, radioactive waste septic or sewage waste, paint, asbestos, drums or tanks (unless empty and flattened, or crushed with tops removed, or empty with holes in the top), animal carcasses, vehicle tires (on or off rim), vehicles or large vehicle parts, pieces of concrete curb or gutter, tree stumps greater than 12" in height and more than 36" across the roots, wire and steel cable, campers, pick-up caps, etc.

As in prior years, we request that you utilize curbside recycling for glass, paper, plastics, and metals. Please patronize the weekly refuse collection for acceptable trash and garbage. In order to eliminate any misunderstanding, community volunteers will be stationed at the site to monitor refuse being placed in containers to ensure compliance with the guidelines and regulations set by the Baltimore County Bureau of Solid Waste Management. We reserve the right to reject loads of materials that in our sole opinion, appear to be commercial in nature or material unacceptable under the program.

This clean-up day is supported by LRV Association and limited to residents only. Legitimate ID must be presented and will be checked. We appreciate your cooperation and hope that the community will take advantage of this event.

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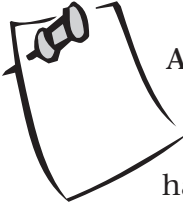

Concerned Resident's Letter to Councilman Gardina

To: Honorable Vincent Gardina, District 5 County Councilman
Dear Mr. Gardina:

The residents of Loch Raven Village hoped the new administration would look favorably on keeping the Loch Raven Community Center (formerly Loch Raven Elementary School) with added upgrading. The stone school is a landmark in our village. It was the anchor for the development of the area. Fifty years ago, it was the main reason that property was bought in this area. As a landmark, it has added to the vitality of the village by being in daily use. The plan to destroy the current building and replace it with a smaller, less attractive metal building is ill advised.

About four years ago, the Village residents overwhelmingly rejected a similar plan. We applaud the plans of the present administration to upgrade older areas. We believe in recycling older buildings to new usage. Smart growth promotes the same ideas.

Loch Raven Village is a very attractive, pleasant, place to live and residents are constantly upgrading their properties. We want the same thing for the school. For many years, the second floor of the school has been kept vacant. With the emphasis on handicapped accessible public buildings, we understand why this was done. However, the cost of adding an elevator to an existing building to make the second floor usable would cost significantly less than the current plan. This renovated space would be perfect for outreach County offices.

Please help us keep this landmark in our community.
