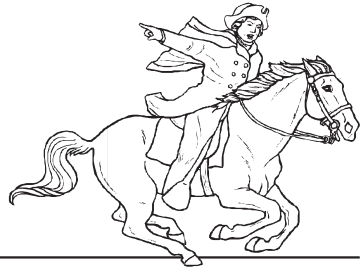

BACK TO SCHOOL NEWS

Wait For School Buses!

Hard to believe but it's true, the beginning of school is upon us. The Baltimore County Police Department is reminding all drivers to stop when the lights on school buses are flashing.

Maryland law states that vehicles must come to a complete stop on both sides of the street if there is no physical divider or barrier. Drivers may not pass the bus until all lights have ceased flashing. Drivers who pass school buses while the lights are flashing will be fined \$555 and issued a 3-point penalty on their record. Drivers who stop but then proceed while the lights are flashing will be fined \$555 and a 2-point penalty will be charged.

Children are not always aware of their surroundings and assume that drivers will stop for them. Youngsters also dart into the road without looking first for traffic. Allow room for the frequent stops that happen during the morning pick up and the afternoon drop off.

Maryland's future is in its children so let's protect them.

Many of our Soldiers don't get mail and enjoy receiving handwritten notes or cards, picture post cards, etc.

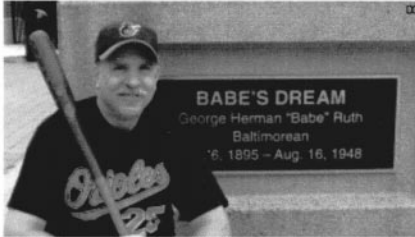

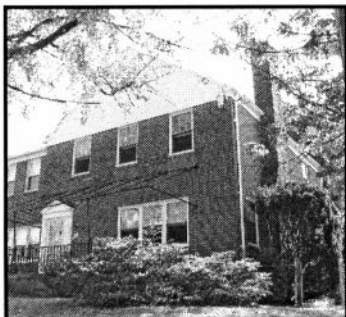
