Message from County Councilman David Marks

As your County Councilman, I have worked hard to advance improvements throughout the Loch Raven Boulevard corridor, including full-service status for the Loch Raven library. As 2013 drew to a close, I found myself trying to get Loch Raven Village included in important discussions about the future of Loch Raven Elementary School.

I love this building. I nominated it for historic status while an Officer in the Baltimore County Historical Trust, and I worked with the Associates of Loch Raven Village to pack the public hearings that led to historic protection. So when there was talk in September about reactivating Loch Raven Elementary School, I thought it deserved some consideration.

I reached out to your President, Gary Herwig, and asked Superintendent Dance to include Loch Raven Village in stakeholder discussions. In late September, I included Loch Raven Village on a list of community associations that needed to be consulted, but unfortunately, that did not really occur.

The initial proposal, which would have split the Pleasant Plains Elementary School district, was shelved in favor of the plan to move the Halstead Academy population to a reactivated Loch Raven Elementary School. Despite community concerns, and a request by me and several state legislators to delay a decision on the


plan, the Board of Education passed the proposal in early November.

Funding for the proposal now moves along two parallel tracks, one at the state level and another through Baltimore County. I will continue to update the Associates of Loch Raven Village on the status of this funding. I have already inquired about a traffic study for any reactivated school and what will happen to those functions currently housed at the existing building.



School Overcrowding Issue Update

On November 5, 2013, the Board of Education for Baltimore County approved the FY15 Capital Planning budget which includes the reactivation of Loch Raven Elementary (LRE). Our elected officials requested a delay of the vote; however it was carried out on schedule. The approved plan does not reflect community input that was gathered and contains what appears to be falsely quantified data.



ALRV Board members, a Knettishall board member and Village residents have formed a committee and are working to change the course of this decision. Committee members have written to, met with and spoken to state and local officials as well as members of the media. The next phase of the process involves several steps. The plan goes both to the State Interagency Committee (IAC) and also through Baltimore County channels. The committee is:

- Preparing a statement to file an appeal regarding the November 5 Board of Education decision,
- Researching the IAC process, and
- Looking at where, when, and how we can have input during these next steps.

How long have you lived in Loch Raven Village?

Alley Repairs

Within the Baltimore County Department of Public Works is the Bureau of Highways, which “repairs, maintains, reconstructs and improves more than 2,600 miles of the County road system, including travel lanes, roadside shoulders, ditches, appurtenance paving, curbs and gutter, sidewalks, alleys and guard rails.”

In response to petitions by resident homeowners, the Bureau has surveyed three alleys for reconstruction. Those alleys are located:

- Behind the 8100 blocks of Loch Raven Boulevard and Kirkwall Court,
- Behind 1613 – 1623 Feldbrook Road, and
- Behind the 1600 blocks of Glen Keith Boulevard and Cottage Lane, including the adjacent alley behind 8201 – 8215 Pleasant Plains Road

While a construction date has not been provided, it is believed that the work will take place in 2014.
