Throughout the year, Village residents rallied and fought the proposal. I became involved because we had no voice in the process and questions about the plan were not answered.

Without question, our voice was heard. However, we could not be where we are today without the help of others outside our community. I would like to thank:

- Councilman David Marks for being a tireless advocate for Loch Raven Village, even though he is losing about 80% of the community due to redistricting.
- Councilwoman Cathy Bevins for jumping in with both feet and supporting our community.
- Delegates Steve Lafferty, Susan Aumann, Bill Frank, and John Cluster, as well as Senators Jim Brochin and Kathy Klausmeier, for their advice and help.
- The Advocates of Baltimore County (ABC) who guided me throughout and supported our community.

And of course, thank you to the residents here who helped in this effort and supported those who set aside their time to address the LRES project issues.

With the school issues behind us, we must make sure our community is more influential than before. There are still issues that require the community to act as one. Though LRES will not be used as a school, we need to help guide the discussion about its future. The enthusiasm and energy in this community are a great starting point to both preserve Loch Raven Village as it is now, and ensure its strength as a community in the future.

Get Out the Vote!

During the July ALRV board meeting, board president Jason Garber illustrated a concern he has for our community --- low voter participation. He found evidence of this when he took the time to crunch some numbers from the June 24 primary election. He shared with residents our community's turnout statistics for each relevant state and county representative race (and County Executive race) in this year's primary election.

We have three polling stations in our neighborhood: Pleasant Plains, Loch Raven Technical Academy and Loch Raven Center. The overall voting numbers by location are below. Keep in mind, only registered Democrats and Republicans were eligible to vote in this election.

Location	% Turnout
Loch Raven Academy	21.19
Loch Raven Center	21.26
Pleasant Plains Elementary	26.43

The Village precincts were roughly 2-7% lower than other adjacent Towson-area voting locations. We can effect change and influence the outcomes of matters that are near and dear to our community's heart and interests if we all get out and vote. Help Loch Raven Village make its voice stronger and louder!

Suspicious Activity

In a community like Loch Raven Village, it's easy to feel like you know or at least recognize most of the people you see. Those people we don't "know" are typically passing through, and we usually don't give them a second thought. Occasionally, we observe someone or something that looks out of the ordinary, and we aren't always sure what to do. How do you know when to call the police?

What constitutes "suspicious activity"? Some of the things to note are:

- A person not entering a home in a normal manner, i.e. through a window
- The sound of breaking glass
- Someone removing license plates, parts or accessories from a car
- A person(s) going door to door or car to car, especially if they are trying to open them
- A person(s) looking in windows or going into back yards
- A person(s) going in and out of a certain residence on a daily or regular basis, especially during late or unusual hours, for short duration.

While there could be reasonable explanations for some or all of these and other behaviors, be assured that the police would prefer to investigate suspicious activity than be called when it is too late!

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
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

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Calling all Halloween Lovers and Decorating Enthusiasts!



Sports Injuries

It's that time of year again! The fall sports season is underway. This means that some of you, or your kids, will sustain an injury. Ankle sprains and strains are the most common, followed by head injuries and injuries to the fingers, knees and face.

What should you do if you become injured?

Sprains

Remember the acronym RICE. Rest—Ice—Compression—Elevation. Ice the affected area for 10 to 15 minutes every few hours for the first few days after an injury. Heat is better suited for keeping things “loose”—like a lower back. Additionally, ibuprofen can help reduce pain and inflammation. Most sprains heal on their own but always consider seeing a doctor who can perform x-rays if there is significant swelling or bruising, any deformity, or if the pain is not improving in a few days. Children's bones sometimes break in more subtle ways than adults. An x-ray may be the only way to identify the break.

Abrasions

Clean any open wounds that your athlete has. Apply an over the counter antibiotic and keep covered with a bandage to prevent infection.

Head injuries

Treat all head injuries with great care. Any athlete who sustains a head injury should immediately be removed from activity. Symptoms such as a persistent headache, nausea, vomiting, or abnormal behavior indicate a need for further medical evaluation. Anyone sustaining a head injury should obtain medical clearance before returning to activity. Use Tylenol or ibuprofen to help with headaches.

Fight is Over

After a year of fighting for and protecting our community, Baltimore County Public Schools (BCPS) Superintendent Dallas Dance withdrew the proposal to renovate and reuse Loch Raven Elementary School. Dr. Dance explained that he did this to “ensure that [BCPS] is maximizing [its] FY16 capital dollars.”

As the BCPS plan evolved, Village residents, ALRV board members, our elected representatives, and others outside the community advocated for an alternative to the proposal.

As recently as July 8, it seemed as if the plan would move forward. However, several factors sealed the fate of the plan.

- Increased construction costs following the successful efforts to save the historic building from the intended full demolition,
- Additional costs required to make the proposed new community center match the historic school building,
- The community’s rejection of the planned center, and
- Increased costs associated with the proposed changes to Cromwell Valley Elementary

BCPS is now looking at other options, including the use of the Bykota Senior Center, to solve overcrowding in the Central Area.

Though the decision to use LRES was made prior to our community’s involvement, throughout the fight to protect our community’s interests, our voice was heard and our community is much better off as a result.

Pleasant Plains Elementary School Slated for Air Conditioning in FY2016

Baltimore County Public Schools (BCPS) has included air conditioning for Pleasant Plains Elementary School (PPES) in its proposed FY 2016 Capital Budget request. This is the first step in a longer process to achieve the end result of a “cool” school. There are several checkpoints ahead. Nevertheless, this is positive development for PPES and our community.

We would like to thank Councilman David Marks, Councilwoman Cathy Bevins, Delegate Steve Lafferty, PPES Principal Maureen Partilla, Village residents, ALRV board members, and many others who advocated for Pleasant Plains over the years.

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
