Letter From The President

Dear Neighbors,

Dumpster Day is May 9th

The Loch Raven Village and Knettishall communities are sponsoring the Spring Dumpster Day to provide an opportunity for residents to dispose of unwanted household and yard items that may be too cumbersome to place in weekly trash or yard pickup. This community clean-up program is managed and paid for by the Baltimore County Bureau of Solid Waste Management to assist communities in keeping their neighborhoods clean.

Dumpster Day will be held on May 9 from 8:00 a.m. until 12:00 noon or until dumpsters are filled at the parking lot of Pleasant Plains Elementary School.

Take advantage of this opportunity to discard unwanted stuff in your home and yard. Please review the acceptable and prohibited items listed. This is not a substitute for the weekly trash pickup, and contractor demolition cannot be accepted.

The County will now charge communities a fine if prohibited materials are found in the dumpsters at the landfill. **PROHIBITED MATERIALS AND CONTRACTORS WILL BE TURNED AWAY!! NO HOUSEHOLD ELECTRONICS ARE ALLOWED!!** You may legally dispose of these items at designated county landfills.

ACCEPTABLE ITEMS:

The following items will be accepted for disposal:

- Box springs / mattresses
- Furniture
- House furnishings
- Lawn furnishings / tools / grills
- Lawn mowers / edgers
- Brush / yard waste
- Plastics / metals / wood scraps
- Toys / bikes / tools
- Broken glass

- Cement / rocks
- Propane tanks (if clean and cut in half)
- Heaters
- Windows / screens
- Gas ranges
- Hot water heaters

PROHIBITED ITEMS:

According to Baltimore County Law the following items are prohibited for disposal and CANNOT BE accepted at the dumpster day event:

- Explosive or flammable materials
- Chemicals / paints/ oils / antifreeze
- Tires (on or off rims)
- Medical / animal wastes
- Batteries / PCBs / liquids or liquid wastes
- Freon (refrigerators / freezers / air conditioners)
- Computers (CPUs, monitors, keyboards, printers, scanners, cables)
- Televisions, VCRs, DVD players, video displays
- Telephones, answering machines, fax machines
- Asphalt, black top
- Large stumps
- Wood logs greater than 8 inches in diameter and 6 feet in length

Volunteers are needed! We had a great turnout last year from both neighborhoods. This is a great community event, so if you aren't sure how to get involved with your neighborhood this is a great way to get started. You get to meet your neighbors and also some of our elected officials who stop by. Volunteers from both communities will be on hand to direct traffic, help keep prohibited items from landing in the dumpsters, assist our senior and handicapped neighbors unload their vehicles, and clean up the parking lot.

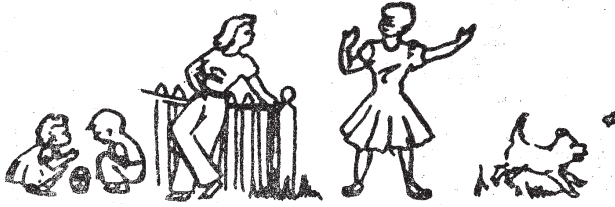

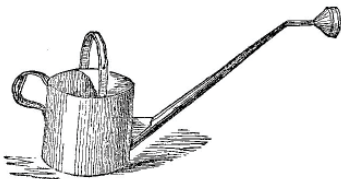
And **happy birthday** on April 6 to **Maya Barr** of Doxbury Road who will be turning 8 years old!

Polling The Pols

*As many of you are aware, Loch Raven Village is now divided between two County Council Districts (5th & 6th) and three Legislative Districts (8, 42A & 42B). As such, our community has many representatives. These brief question and answer sessions are intended to introduce Village residents to all of our new representatives and give a sense of backgrounds, personalities and goals for each. In this installment, ALRV President Jason Garber interviews 8th District Delegate **John Cluster**.*

Position: Delegate, 8th District; Deputy Minority Whip.

Life Before Being Delegate: Police Officer, Baltimore County, including Sergeant of SWAT Team for 7 years. Small business owner (with his wife) of “A Family Affair,” an embroidery and screen printing business.

Grew Up In: Arbutus.

Favorite Restaurants: Casey’s on Joppa Road, in Parkville

Favorite TV Shows: Survivor. “I never miss it and I always wanted to apply to be on it.”

What about your background helps you as a delegate?

I understand community problems. I went through the same ones as part of the PTA, as part of the Parkville Business Association and Loch Raven-IHM Rec Council programs. The better politicians are ones that were involved in the community. They are more attuned to what is going on. There is more of a passion to take care of their communities.

Anything else?

Playing sports, because I was a member

of a team. Being part of a team has had a strong influence over a lot of what I am today. [Note: Delegate Cluster played football with former Governor Ehrlich while growing up].

What are you most proud of in your time as a delegate?

My constituent work. I like helping people. A good example is there was a natural gas leak on Ridge Road and the residents called and were told that it would take months for someone to come out. My office called BGE and the next day BGE was there and made the repairs. My office handles about 200 constituent calls a year. I am very accessible. If you need something, please contact me.

What makes the 8th District great?

The diversity in the district. There is also a mix of young and old. There are 2-3 generations of family that still live in the same community.

What challenges confront the 8th District?

What drives communities are education and criminal justice. If we can stay on top of those areas, we will have more people moving in. We will have vibrant communities.

What do you do in your free time?

I like to spend time with my family. I also like to play golf.

So what happened to Tiger Woods?

Fame went to Tiger’s head. You need to be grounded. You need to remember where you came from.

What is it like working in Annapolis?

There is still camaraderie. On the House floor it can be contentious between parties during the day, but we can still go out, be friends, and have a beer together.

Flea Market to aid orphans

Babcock Presbyterian Church will hold its annual flea market on April 25 from 8 a.m. to 1 p.m. (Rain date is May 2). This year the church is excited to announce that all of the proceeds from the event will benefit a very special organization. It is called SOS Children's Villages and is active in several regions of Kenya. Begun in 1971 to meet the needs of an ever-increasing number of orphaned and neglected children, SOS sponsors homes with a caregiver "mother" and ten children each. Through their SOS Family Strengthening Programs, the organization also provides day care, education, vocational training and medical services.

Babcock Church first became aware of SOS when two of its members, Howard and Lois Muthungu, began sponsoring a child through the organization. Howard and Lois have visited the orphanages on a few of their trips to Kenya and have seen first-hand the good work that is being done.

Money raised at this flea market will be used to house, feed, and educate children at the Nairobi branch of SOS. Babcock hopes to sponsor three children. So come out to Babcock Church on April 25, find some bargains, chat with some neighbors, and support a worthy cause.
